RE: Waste & Recycle Disposal Information

On July 1st of each year, Town of Maidstone garbage bags become available at Town Hall. You may pick up your free 52 bags for full time residents and 26 bags for seasonal residents. Additional garbage bags may be purchased for \$3.00 per bag, rolls of 26 will cost \$78.00. See attached Waste Schedule.

A quick overview is as follows:

- Trash and Recycle pick up is scheduled for Mondays except for weeks with holiday. It should be put by the road by 8:00 am and should be visible for Hodgdon Trucking. All routes are one-way, trash will be picked up based on the route, **the truck will not stop on the way back**
- Garbage must be put out in Town of Maidstone, purple bags, the weight should not exceed 30-35 lbs.
- Recycling process: (See attached Recycling and Waste Disposal Guide)
 - Aluminum and tin must be separated
 - Paper must be separated (no paper plates, paper towels, or tissues)
 - Corrugated and boxboard can be put together (no pizza boxes), cardboard must be broken down to smaller than 34 inches.
 - No caps should be left on plastic bottles or containers

Bulky Waste Day – Saturday July 18, 2026, 8AM to Noon, 1342 VT Route 102, McVetty Residence

Acceptable Bulky items include but not limited to: couches, chairs, box springs & mattresses (cost of \$40-\$45), wood (painted, stained, pressure treated), plywood, fiberglass insulation, roofing shingles, toilets, sheetrock, carpets, non-metal sinks & bathtubs, windows, propane cylinders, refrigerators & freezers, air conditioners & non-recycled plastics.

Acceptable Metal items include but are not limited to: sinks & bathtubs, stoves, grills, dishwashers, microwave ovens, water heaters, furnaces, conventional ovens, white goods, metal car parts, pots & pans, steel, copper, brass, aluminum, and tin. Tires accepted for a fee depending on size and if on rim, <18" are \$3 each, with a rim \$6 each, tires 19-25" are \$9 each, with a rim \$18 each.

HOUSEHOLD TRASH BAGS: Tax-paying residents receive 52 trash bag/year free. Tax-paying nonresidents receive 26 trash bags/year. Pick up or purchase additional trash bags at town office.

ADDITIONAL MATERIALS ACCEPTED AT THE LYNDONVILLE RECYCLING CENTER, 224 CHURCH ST
FOOD SCRAPS: Any food item, including meat, bones, and dairy. No PLU stickers, plastic, metals.

SPECIAL WASTES: Scrap metal, electronics (TVs, computers, radio/stereos, gaming systems, telephones), automotive batteries, metal aerosols cans, hard cover books, fluorescent bulbs. Tires (fees apply)

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES – Drop and Swaps are held in the spring and fall in Derby. H.O.P.E in Lyndonville accepts donations of lightly used clothing.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE – May through September in Lyndonville **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY**, and special events throughout the District. June – September. Call for details.

Scheduling ahead ensures that a qualified individual will be on-site ready to accept your hazardous waste.

****HHW Collections are free and open to residents of all DISTRICT TOWNS****

What are *Household Hazardous Products*? They are consumer products that contain ingredients that **may be**:

Toxic- poisonous if eaten, breathed, or absorbed through the skin

Corrosive- can burn or destroy living tissue if spilled on skin

Reactive- creates fumes, heat, or explosion hazards if mixed with certain materials such as water

Explosive- can explode with exposure to heat or pressure

Flammable/Ignitable- can easily be set on fire

To determine if a product in your home is hazardous, check the label for the following words:

Danger indicates that the substance is extremely flammable, corrosive, or toxic.

Poison means that the substance is highly toxic.

Caution/Warning is put on all other hazardous substances that are a somewhat lesser hazard but are still dangerous if the directions are not followed closely.

Conditionally Exempt Generator businesses can also use the Lyndonville collections for the actual cost of the disposal of their materials. Please call ahead for pricing and an appointment.
